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Basic Manners for Climbers

- 1. Please take all trash home with you.
- 2. Do not catch insects or pick flowers or plants, etc. (The only thing it is OK to "take" is photos!)
- 3. Please relieve yourself at locations where toilets are provided.
- 4. Mountain weather is changeable, so please you have prepared well and planned with time to spare before climbing.
- 5. "The person ascending has priority over the person descending the trail." This is the basic rule, but adapt as necessary depending on the circumstances.
- 6. Please say "Konnichiwa (Hello)" whenever you meet or pass someone on the trail!



Hiruzen Three Peaks: Mt. Kami-Hiruzen, Mt. Naka-Hiruzen, and Mt. Shimo-Hiruzen

▲ Mt. Kami-Hiruzen Height: 1202 m, Time required: approx. 2 hrs. (one-way)

▲ Mt. Naka-Hiruzen Height: 1123 m, Time required: approx. 2 hrs. (one-way)

▲ Mt. Shimo-Hiruzen Height: 1100 m, Time required: approx. 1 hr. 40 mins. (one-way)

The elevarion for each course differs around 600m, and each peak can be reached in around 2 hours from the trail starting point.


All three peaks can be reached via a connecting ridge but there are some steep slopes in parts and close to the summits there are beech tree forests.

Mt. Kami-Hiruzen, Mt. Naka-Hiruzen, and Mt. Shimo-Hiruzen are known collectively as the Hiruzen Three Peaks and it takes around 7 to 8 hours to traverse all of them. Mt. Shimo-Hiruzen becomes a field of bamboo grass from the 5th station, and there are wide, open views to be enjoyed from the 8th station on Mt. Naka-Hiruzen and the 2nd station of Mt. Kami-Hiruzen. There is also a route to climb Mt. Kami-Hiruzen that passes through the Orogatawa wetland, although it is not the route generally used. Fawn lilies blossom across all three mountains in May, growing in clusters along the trail that traverses across the three peaks. Mt. Kami-Hiruzen has a superb view of Mt. Daisen and Mt. Karasugasen from Yarigamine at the 8th station, and at the end of June, bamboo lilies flower there. One of Japan's top 100 exquisite and well-conserved waters, "Shiogama-no-Reisen" spring is at the Mt.

Naka-Hiruzen trail starting point and is a popular spot, with toilets also provided. From the top of Mt. Naka-Hiruzen, the Hiruzen Kogen Highlands can be seen spread below like a miniature garden, but unfortunately Mt. Daisen is not visible from there. Mt. Naka-Hiruzen has the best view. Toilets are also provided at the Mt. Shimo-Hiruzen trail starting point, and the view from just after the 5th station at Kumoidaira is spectacular.



Asanabewashigasen

Climbing guide map of Maniwa

Mt. Mihirayama, Mt. Asanabewashigasen and Mt. Kenashigasen

Mt. Mihirayama Height: 1010 m, Time required: 45 mins. one-way/ approx. 2 hrs. round trip

From the summit, enjoy a view that takes in the south face of Mt. Daisen, Mt. Karasugasen, and the Hiruzen Three Peaks to the north, and extends from Mt. Kenashigasen to Mt. Asanabewashigasen in the south. There are no steep slopes after the trail starting point on the forest road, and this mountain is popular even with beginners because it can be climbed in around 45 minutes. From the ridge onward, enjoy views of bamboo grass and Japanese silver grass on both sides, and walk along the earthen wall (formerly used when war horses were bred in the area) which marks the prefectural border to reach the summit. Mt. Mihirayama can be climbed almost as a hike, but take care because the earthen wall can be slippery underfoot. Although steep in places, it is possible to descend down the Anagatawa pass, making a total round-trip of around 2 hours. From the Anagatawa pass, by climbing the ridge to the south, it is possible to traverse across to Mt. Asanabewashigasen.

Mt. Kenashigasen Height: 1219 m, Time required: 1 hr. 30 mins. one-way/approx. 3 hrs. round trip

From the Tanami district of Shinjo Village, the trail follows alongside a river and passes through a cedar forest. After the steep slope, there are more wild grasses and flowers, and a broadleaved forest containing many large trees, including beech trees.

After the rest shelter at the 9th station, close to the summit, the view suddenly opens out and becomes much wider. The view from the summit is superb. To the north, there are views extending from Yumigahama to Mt. Daisen and from Mt. Karasugasen to the Hiruzen Three Peaks. In addition, from the ridge there is a trail that traverses from Mt. Hakubasen to Mt. Asanabewashigasen and continues on to Mt. Mihirayama, and during the Golden Week

Mt. Asanabewashigasen Height: 1074 m, Time required: 1 hr. 10 mins. one-way/ approx. 3 hrs. round trip

This mountain was used as the venue for the mountaineering competition of the 2005 National Sports Festival of Japan, which was held in Okayama Prefecture.

Take the Kawakami No. 2 Forest Road from near the Notoro tunnel, and continue for a while to reach the trail starting point. The trail climbs gently through forest almost along the ridge line, overlooking wild grasses and flowers. The trail is rich with many flowers, including Fringed galax which bloom here from spring through fall. Follow the ridge trail that continues on to Mt. Mihirayama and then turn left along a gentle slope to reach the summit. There is no clear view from the summit, but by climbing onto the observation deck, a 360 degree view opens before you. To the west, there is a ridge trail that continues from Mt. Kanagatani to Mt. Kenashigasen. From the summit, the Notorotawa pass descends along the Chugoku Electric Power Co., Inc.'s maintenance road. Descend slowly along a disused road to the entrance to the Kawakami No. 2 Forest Road.

Mt. Hitsugasen

▲ Mt. Hitsugasen Height: 953 m, Time required: 2 hrs. one-way/ approx. 4 hrs. round-trip

The beginning of the trail passes houses and fields, leading to a steep slope before the forest road. The road leads north into the forest, near fields of bamboo grass, and ascends directly along the ridge. On the way, you can turn right and enter the Tengu forest, with impressive giant trees and a small forest shrine. The view from the summit extends from Yubara Onsen to the Hiruzen Three Peaks. A ridge to the West leads to Mt. Hoshiyama, which you should take for your descent until you reach a forest road. The descent leads past the Obasara Hamlet ruins and Ryuzu Waterfall to National Route 313, which is 400m south of the trail starting point.

Mt. Minagasen

▲ Mt. Minagasen Height: 1159 m, Time required: 1 hr. 50 mins. (one-way)

The trail starting point lies north of the Hiruzen Kogen Campsite and the trail climbs gently through a Konara (quercus serrata) forest, alongside the earthen wall formerly used for war horse-breeding. The slope gets steeper before reaching Mt. Futamatayama which has a great view to the south. The trail then descends a little before the final climb to Mt. Minagasen.

There are relatively large numbers of giant beech trees in a forest near the summit and lots of bamboo grass. In early spring, the Magnolia salicifolia flowers are striking.

Mt. Hoshiyama

▲ Mt. Hoshiyama Height: 1030 m, Time required: 1 hr. 20 mins. (one-way)

The East trail starting point begins from the side of the Visitor Center and becomes a mountain trail before climbing gently through the copse of the memorial forest. After circumventing Mt. Maesen, the trail converges with the trail from the West trail starting point. From here the ridge trail becomes slightly steeper. The summit is past the large rock. There is a Class 1 Triangulation Station and a 360 degree view of the Chugoku mountains. There is also a trail that traverses to Mt. Ougiyama, Mt. Gorinzan, and Mt. Hitsugasen.

Mt. Hotokegasen

▲ Mt. Hotokegasen Height: 743 m, Time required: 35 mins. (one-way)

Mt. Hotokegasen is one of only eight "Three Crown" mountains in Japan with a Class 1 Triangulation Station, a drainage divide and a prefectural border. From the pass on the Bessho Takamatsu Forest Road, climb the narrow steps on the mountain side to reach the trail starting point. Please note there are no parking spaces. The trail slowly curves to the left, zigzagging through a cypress forest, and then follows the ridge directly ahead. After 20 mins, the trail reaches the first peak which looks out westward over the Hiruzen Kogen. Continue further to reach the summit of Mt. Hotokegasen. To the north is a fabulous view over the townscapes of Kurayoshi and Sekigane that extend to the Japan sea.

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Mt. Tsugurosen

Height: 1118 m, Time required: From Central trail starting ▲ Tsugurosen point approx. 1 hr. 10 mins. (one-way)/ From East trail starting point approx. 50 mins. (one-way)

The trail begins by climbing through woods, and after ascending directly through forest, reaches a wide ridge with cypress trees. After climbing the ridge for about 30 mins., the slope eases but then becomes steep again. Continuing through a copse, the slope eases again and the view widens out. Climb a little further to reach the gently sloping summit, spread with Sasa kurilensis and broadleaf bamboo. The view encompasses a majestic row of mountains extending from the Hiruzen Three Peaks and beautiful Mt. Daisen in the north-west, and the Japan Sea in the north. Moreover, the East trail starting point (which can reach the summit in a shorter time) can be found by entering the forest road from the Central trail starting point and continuing in the direction of the Ningyo pass. By using the main forest road, it is possible to make a round trip within three hours.

Mt. Amagoisen

▲ Mt. Amagoisen Height: 889 m, Time required: 2 hrs. 30 mins. (one way)

Climb along the forest road which curves broadly to the left and continue to the northwest. After walking a while, turn right at the meeting point with the Shimoyubara hamlet to climb up the mountain trail. It climbs up through a cedar forest and through a copse. Push a path through Japanese sliver grass and dense weeds, to finally reach a peak where a radio reflection plate stands. Climb straight on from there, to reach an observation deck with a tremendous view. From the observation deck, there is a view of the whole Shimoyubara area. Climb north from there along the Tsurione ridge to reach the summit of Mt. Amagoisen.









Mt. Misakayama

▲ Mt. Misakayama Height: 903 m Time required: 2 hrs. (one way)

Mt. Misakayama was a difficult spot on the route to Mt. Daisen that has been sung about in old Japanese songs (in lyrics meaning "The 12 km of Mt. Misakayama feels like 20 km"). There is a path cut through the mountain in both the north and south, and the path in the south is known as the Jikkoku Touge ("Ten-country") path which was known as such because it looked out over ten countries in four directions. At the ruins of the Jikkoku Chaya "10-koku" Tea House, where a guard used to be stationed and was paid 10-koku of rice by the Tsuyama Clan, there is an origin of country name monument, explaining the theory that the name of Mimasaka Area in northern Okayama, derives from Mt. Misakayama. From the Kuginuki-kogawa hamlet, follow the forest road for around 20 mins. to reach the trail starting point. From the trail starting point, follow the winding path through a cypress forest, until it gradually begins to curve more sharply, then climb for around 30 mins. from there to reach the pass where a stone Doso-shin (spirit to protect travelers) stands. From the pass, follow the ridge that climbs to the right to reach the summit. There are several steep slopes and peaks, before reaching the summit of Mt. Misakayama in around 40 mins. Descend to the south by passing through the Jikkoku Touge pass


